Columbia, SC - The TwinCity Outreach Mission will celebrate the official unveiling and National Press Conference of the Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune South Carolina License Plate on February 12, 2013. The unveiling will be held from 10 a.m. – 12 p.m. at the South Carolina Statehouse. All are invited to witness this historic moment in history.

Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune is the first African American to be honored with this prestigious distinction. On June 19, 2012, a General bill was passed by the South Carolina House and Senate and signed into law by Governor Nikki Haley of South Carolina on June 26, 2012 for a special license plate in the name of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune.

A native of Mayesville, SC, Dr. Bethune was an American educator, civil rights leader, and founder of the National Council of Negro Women. Known for starting a school for African American students in Daytona Beach, Florida with \$1.50, Dr. Bethune was also advisor to four United States Presidents and served as a member of the Black Cabinet during President Franklin D. Roosevelt's administration.

In honor of this historic accomplishment, Ed Miller and Jereleen Hollimon-Miller, former Mayor of Mayesville and great-grandniece of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune welcome Mr. Kevin Shwedo, Executive Director of the South Carolina Department of Motor Vehicle to unveil this historic license plate to the state, nation, and global community.
